Re: Disposition of Land to the City of Richmond to Support the No.5 Road and Cambie Road Intersection Improvement Project

The City of Richmond (the City) is providing a letter of support for the proposed disposition of Land to the City to support the No.5 Road and Cambie Road Intersection Improvement Project (the “Project”).

The Project includes introducing new left-turn lanes and dedicated left-turn signals in all four directions, as well as pedestrian and sidewalk enhancements along the north side of the intersection.

The Project was initiated through public request to the City, and will achieve the following benefits:

- x Improve safety for all road users;
- x Reduce congestion through the intersection; and
- x Improve comfort and accessibility for pedestrians and cyclist by providing a wider sidewalk space, more buffer from vehicles and improved connectivity.

The City completed a review of the top 20 collision-prone intersections within Richmond, and No. 5 Road and Cambie Road was identified as the 6th most collision-prone intersection in the City, reinforcing the need for safety upgrades at this location.

Implementation of these traffic and pedestrian safety improvements require additional property and the Project cannot proceed without access to the Richmond School District lands. The City intends on
